
Rally Report: Alfa National

Coffee Filters ... Who Knew ???

And you can buy 1,000 at the Dollar Tree for almost nothing!

- 1. Cover bowls or dishes when cooking in the microwave. Coffee filters make excellent covers.
- 2. Clean windows and mirrors. Coffee filters are lint-free, so they'll leave windows sparkling.
- 3. Protect China. Separate your good dishes by putting a coffee filter between each dish.
- 4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.
- 5. Protect a cast-iron skillet. Place a coffee filter in the skillet to absorb moisture and prevent rust.

Norcold Refrigerator Recall

There is an active recall on certain Norcold refrigerators, some of which may have been installed in Alfa coaches. If you have one of these, it presents a fire hazard if not corrected (several coach fires, including at least one Alfa, are suspected to have been linked to the Norcold refrigerator). Please take a few minutes to see if your unit is on the recall list. The following is information from the Norcold website:

1200LR, 1200LRIM and 1201LRIM Series Models

Norcold has voluntarily recalled 1200LR, 1200LRIM and 1201LRIM model gas/electric refrigerators built from 1996 through February of 2001. Affected models have a cooling unit serial number (found on the solution chamber and viewed through the refrigerator vent door outside the RV) from 700000 - 1273700.

The defect is a potential cooling unit leak caused during AC electric mode operation. If a leak occurs, the refrigerator's cooling performance will deteriorate and a yellow powder residue will be evident at the cooling unit's heating element. Because extended operation of a leaking cooling unit in the AC electric mode may result in a fire, immediate repair.

An affected refrigerator without a leak must still be serviced to have its cooling unit repaired to prevent any potential future problem.

Persons owning one of the affected models should:

- Turn Off the refrigerator. Do not use it until it has been repaired.
- Contact a Dealer/Service Center to arrange a service date as soon as possible. The cooling unit will be repaired at no charge for parts and labor.
- *Note: On some units, the serial number (outside) is different than the one on the inside of the fridge!
- **Note: This will likely affect 2002 and 2003 Alfas, but everyone would be wise to check.
- ***Note: An owner of a 2002 model checked his serial number and it was not on the list. He called Norcold, and found it was part of the recall. So if you have an early model, and are not on the list, you may want to call anyway. Norcold Customer Service is at 800-543-1219

Retarded Grandparents

Problem in 2007 and later Alfas

John Peters has reported the following problem that may affect others who own 2007 or later model Alfas, as they have different chassis instrumentation controls (Freightliner Chassis changed in 2007).

John's letter to Freightliner:

"It started with the RV in motion, and the normal output of the little computer chip in the dash stopped (no Odometer, Speedometer, Fuel gauge, output to the Jake Brake) and it started flashing and beeping at the usual rate of the beeper for the turn signals. The icons surrounding the console flashed as it beeped. It stopped and resumed working after a few hundred miles. Then after more miles driving, failed again. Something is intermittent but the failure is not 100% yet. But since it causes loss of the Jake brake and indications like fuel level and speed it needs to be found and fixed."

Freightliner's Response:

John, This new dash system has the pollak gauges. If you lift up the dash and look at the back of the lbcu (this is the lcd display looking at front) it has a small 4 pin connector at lower corner and 2 larger connectors 24 pin and 32 pin connector. If this does not have a good connection or loses ign voltage or battery voltage due to connection or spread terminal this may be the issue. I would unplug these 2 larger connections and look at terminals on connector side. Sometimes a connection may look good, but by unplugging and plugging back in, corrects the issue.
