After Farmington, Terry and I then attended the South Loafers outing near Tombstone, AZ. We had 17 South Loafers there, plus the couple who serve as park managers at the RV Park who own a 2004 Alfa motorhome! Naturally, they were invited to join us, plus I talked to and gave them information on joining the AlfaSeeYas. They

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will be traveling and moving to their other seasonal work camping area and hope to participate with us in the future.

When we stopped in Tucson, AZ we were greeted by Wayne and Joy Holt, former members of the AlfaSeeYas, and are now living in Tucson. They are very interested in renewing, and want to join the South Loafers and participate in upcoming outings and the Alfa owners' annual rally. I remember several folks previously saying they were unable to go this year but hoped we would do it again next year, and several who attended this year would like to do it again. If you would like to go, and would like to be a rally/co-rally wagon master, we would very much like to hear from you. We are well underway in obtaining registrations for our pre-rally coming up very soon at Emerald Desert in January 2012, after which we will be caravanning to the FMCA Western Area Rally in Indio. I have been in contact with one of the FMCA Western Area folks about us possibly volunteering at the rally. They would like help in monitoring the seminars, helping out the presenter as needed, handing out questionnaires, and providing an assessment of the seminar, for about 4-5 seminars per volunteer. There is a dinner for all volunteers the night before the rally starts (we will be caravanning over that day anyway, so we will be there in time for it). We will be contacting those who have signed up for the pre-rally soon to see if our members would like to do so. Naturally, it is voluntary, but since it is likely a number of our folks will be going to the seminars anyway, this may be a very useful way to do our part in helping out. Also, if you are unable to attend our pre-rally, but are joining us at the FMCA rally, please let me know and I will include you in our contact list asking for volunteers.

Terry and I have recently found a new source for AlfaSeeYas chapter jackets and hats (info on the previous source in unavailable). We were able to obtain them at a lower price and yet have them personalized with your first name and in your choice of two colors. We will be posting the info on how to order them on our website in the very near future. Terry and I showed the folks at our Balloon Fiesta rally the samples we had, and received several orders right there! We are going to provide a free personalized jacket to anyone who volunteers to be a rally master or co-rally master, in appreciation of their work and in hopes that it will encourage others to volunteer in the future. We are also going to provide a jacket and hat to our chapter officers, so they may 'advertise' our chapter to other Alfa owners and hopefully obtain new chapter members.

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#### ALBUQUERQUE INTERNATIONAL BALLOON FIESTA

40 participants in 20 rigs made a check mark on their bucket list at the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta October 1-9. Neither pictures nor words adequately convey the beauty and fun of watching 500-600 hot air balloons gently traveling above your head and coach.



A parade of Alfas', and a few SOBs (Some Other Brand) descended upon the ABQ Fiesta RV Park on Friday morning September 30<sup>th</sup>. Wagon masters Craig and Terilu Christen guided them with military precision into a straight formation of 6 inches from the road line.

At the afternoon welcome meeting, Craig discussed successful boon-docking, reviewing and taking questions about the boon-docking instructional email all participants received prior to arrival. Boon-docking for 9 days

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was much easier than most of us had anticipated with trepidation. Personally, Bob and I left with fresh water still in the tank, and room in both the black and gray water tanks. So boon-docking for an extended period was another check on our bucket list!

For those that needed it, fresh water trucks traveled through the park each day, along with a Schwan's truck, newspaper carriers, RV repair technicians, and RV merchandise vendors. By Wednesday, there was a running joke going about a 'group dump'. If several rigs coordinated, there was a discount for the rigs that chose the 'group dump' option.

The Fiesta officially began Saturday morning October 1<sup>st</sup> with the opening ceremonies and Mass Ascension. Most of us attended and watched from the launch field as the Fiesta coordinated breaking the Guinness World Book record for the most balloons to launch within one hour, stealing the record back from the French, who had beaten the ABQ record a few years before.



The ABQ Fiesta is one of the rare events where not only are you allowed to walk on the field, but you are actively encouraged to participate in 'crewing' for a balloon team. Craig and Terilu encouraged all rally participants to sign up to 'crew' for a team. In doing so, you were given a 'crew pass' which allowed you to access the events several times a day. The rally covered 5 tickets for the events, and a ticket is required at each morning and evening event. Many of us turned our tickets back in to Craig, saving money for the rally and the Alfa See Ya's.

Since the balloons launch early in the morning, most of the morning events were completed by 10 AM. There were plenty of food and merchandise vendors for your browsing pleasure. Favorite food vendors were JR's

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breakfast burritos and the huge Dutch Boy doughnuts. Numerous vendors offered jewelry, pottery, art, t-shirts, sweaters, and other interesting items to assist you in donating money to the local economy.

In the evening, many of us returned to the Fiesta Park for the "Balloon Glow" and "Afterglow Fireworks".



Travel to Fiesta Park was via shoe leather express or taking the buses that traveled through the park on a regular basis. The buses had a dedicated lane, so the ride was a short one, with riders not being delayed by the heavy morning and evening traffic. One evening our driver had us singing songs and in a competition with another bus for most enthusiastic bus riders, an interesting experience!

Each morning from 7-9 (with coffee starting at 5:30) Craig hosted a Continental Breakfast in our Rally Tent. In the afternoon, each day, we had 'happy hour' where we reviewed our day's activities. We had an excellent

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opening evening catered dinner. The caterers were a Native American couple, who graciously spent an extra hour discussing their heritage with our group. On our last evening, we had a delicious gourmet pizza dinner, paid for by money saved by the 'crew team' members.

Crewing for a team was not as physically demanding as you would assume. It consisted of assisting the crew with laying out the balloon 'envelope', holding ropes, holding down the basket, and riding in the chase vehicle. At the landing, each of the previous activities was completed in reverse. The most strenuous part was the tail gate party, where you were forced to consume excess amounts of food, champagne, margaritas and pina colada's. It was strenuous, but Alfa See Ya's are a tough group and we made it through with adding only one notch to our belt buckles.

Many days the balloons landed in or behind the RV Park, giving those who did not 'crew' for a team, the opportunity to witness and participate in a balloon landing. Sitting in front of your motor home, sipping coffee, tea or cocoa, while watching the show overhead was a favorite activity.



Other rally activities included optional group trips to The Pueblo Cultural Center, a train trip to Santa Fe with a professional tour guide, riding up the Sandia Tram with lunch at the mountain top, visiting the ABQ History Museum, a walking tour of Old Town ABQ, visiting the Balloon Museum, discounted buffet lunch at a

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casino, touring the Atomic Energy Museum, and a golfing expedition. On Wednesday afternoon, we had the Coach Walk, where we microscopically examined each participating rig, for decorating ideas.

Friday evening, also with saved rally money, we had a gift exchange. Much laughter and stealing occurred during the game, matched by the trading afterwards.

Thanks go to many people, including those who volunteered their generators and gas for our lights and coffee, cleaned up after the breakfasts and dinners, worked with others who had coach issues, scrubbed and vacuumed for the coach walk and used their cars for carpools. Very special thanks go to our Wagon Masters, Craig and Terilu Christen for all their preparation and hard work.

So update your bucket list, because several members have already expressed interest in a balloon fiesta rally next year. Unfortunately, Craig and Terilu won't be able to be our wagon masters next year, but provided an extensive record of what they did this year. We are very interested in obtaining volunteers for next year. Please contact us if you are interested in attending and being a wagon master. Watch the newsletter and the website for the information. #### 2012 ALFA OWNERS CLUB RALLY

Hi, I am Larry York. Shirley and I are the Rally Masters for the 2012 Alfa Owners' Club Annual Rally. We appreciate Randy giving us the opportunity to provide you with some information about the 2012 Rally

The Rally will be held April  $12^{th}$  -  $17^{th}$ , 2012. This years' Rally theme is "Mining for Gold". Therefore it is fitting that the location of our Rally is at the Canyon Vistas RV Resort (a Cal-AM Resort) located in Gold Canyon, AZ.

Gold Canyon is an unincorporated community located about 40 minutes east of the Phoenix Sky Harbor airport at the foot of the beautiful Superstition Mountains-supposedly the site of the Lost Dutchman's Gold Mine.

Enclosed is a registration form for this years' Rally. The fees consist of:

Basic registration fee - covers two people per rig, includes two commemorative Rally patches per rig, a welcome packet, three catered meals, coffee and donuts each morning, an ice cream social, a wine and cheese tasting, a pet parade, door prizes, Chapter gift basket drawings, and raffle prizes. Both of you will also have access to Rally activities which include: craft classes (there will be an additional fee collected at the Rally for specific classes), seminars, vendors, pool aerobics and

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walks each morning, an open house/coach walk and yard sale, a used book sale (please bring your used books to donate to the sale), and a BBQ sponsored by Alfateers RV Service Center.

- Park fee site rent for six nights with full hook ups including taxes. Note that this
  rate will be good for five days prior to and after the Rally provided the dates are
- attached to the Rally dates. If you want to arrive prior to the Rally and/or stay
  after the Rally, you should make those arrangements direct with the Resort. Please
  note, that you may have to move when the Rally starts or after it ends if the
  Resort has the site reserved for someone else.
- · Optional fees -
  - Ladies Luncheon lunch for one person, plus the opportunity to win a raffle prize.
  - Non-Chapter Member additional fee for attendees who are not currently members of one of the six Alfa Owners' Club Chapters. For those who join a Chapter prior to or during the Rally, we will refund this fee.
  - Additional people additional fee for each person over the two who are registered for the Rally.
  - Extra 2012 Rally Patches for those who would like additional Rally patches over the two that are included with your registration fee.

We will have a golf tournament during the Rally. As soon as it is set-up we will provide you the cost to participate in the tournament and ask if you will participate or not prior to the Rally. Fees will be collected at the welcome desk when you arrive at the Rally.

We also plan on having a vendor on-site for rig/vehicle washes and waxes. Those who want their rig and/or tow vehicle washed or washed and waxed can sign-up and pay at the welcome desk when you arrive.

In addition, we MAY have additional on - off site activities that may require a fee. In the event we do offer additional activities, we will have sign-up sheet(s) at the welcome desk and any fees will be paid when you sign-up.

Alfateers RV Service Center will also be on-site to provide service and selected installations during the Rally. Separate sign-up and information/price sheets are available for those that need service or want something new installed or replaced on their rig. I urge you to sign-up as soon as possible as their work schedule gets full quickly.

Space is limited as we can only accommodate 120 rigs, therefore, if you are planning on attending the Rally, you should send your registration in as soon as possible.



#### Pork Chops Mexicana - \*\*

Prep: 10 min. | Total: 23 min.

- 4 boneless pork chops (1 lb.), 1/2-in.-thick
- 11/4 cups Taco Bell Home Originals Salsa
- 1/2 cup finely chopped Planters Cocktail Peanuts
  - 1 tsp. unsweetened cocoa
- 1/8 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup chopped cilantro or green onions

COOK chops in large nonstick skillet sprayed with cooking spray on medium-high heat 2 to 3 min. on each side or until browned on both sides.

COMBINE salsa, peanuts, cocoa and cinnamon; spoon over chops. Reduce heat to medium-low; simmer 5 min. or until chops are no longer pink in the center and sauce is thickened, turning chops over and stirring sauce after 3 min.

SPRINKLE with cilantro.
