For your planning, please "save the dates" for several future AlfaSeeYas chapter functions: our annual pre-rally Jan 4-8 in Palm Desert, CA (more details later in this newsletter), after which we will caravan to the nearby annual FMCA Western Area rally in Indio, CA to be held Jan 9-13, 2013 (details and registration will be in the FMCA magazine). March 20-23, 2013 will be the INTO rally in Tucson, AZ (more info on this one will also be in the FMCA magazine). INTO is the FMCA

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International Area Organization into which our FMCA chapter (and many others) are grouped, as we are not associated with any particular geographic region, but rather have members from throughout the US and Canada. I have never attended one of these, but Terry and I plan to do so, and hope some of you will join us. Check future chapter newsletters and FMCA magazine issues for more details when they are released. The 2013 FMAC Family Reunion will be in Gillette, WY June 19-22, 2013. We will have a

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chapter representative attending, hopefully many of you will also. Then, Sep 11-20, 2013 will be our chapter rally in Gettysburg and Lancaster, PA details and registration (information is in this newsletter). Fran and John Kurz have already done a great job in planning it out, and there will be more information in our future newsletters. For those of us traveling some distance to attend it, we are looking at having some other chapter functions before and after the Sept rally. Please send me your ideas of where and when would be good to have one, and we will see if we can set something up. As you may remember from one of my first messages, our intent is to try to have more Chapter functions in the Eastern US (and Canada too), so I need your thoughts and ideas.

We had a great time at the Annual Alfa Owners Rally this past April in Gold Canyon, seeing old friends, making new ones, and obtaining several new chapter members! We had a chapter meeting on April 17, with over 40 members and guests in attendance. We had a number of topics including recent and planned outings, reminding folks to vote on the proposed Bylaws and Standing Rules amendments, and recruiting of new members. We also had several drawings and gave away a free one year FMCA and AlfaSeeYas chapter member- ships, a free 2 year dues extension to an existing Chapter member, and an FMCA Road Atlas.

Thanks to those of you who took the time to read and then vote recently on our proposed amendments to our Chapter Bylaws and Standing Rules. We received votes from 19 member RVers, with the following results:

19 Yes votes for the Proposed

Amendments to the Chapter Bylaws. Our Chapter Bylaws require a 2/3 affirmative vote of those voting to amend them-these proposed amendments received 100% affirmative votes, therefore the proposed amendments to the Chapter Bylaws passed.

15 Yes votes for Proposed Amendments 1-3 to the Chapter Standing Rules (4 of those voting did not cast votes for the Proposed Amendments to the Standing Rules)

14 Yes, 1 No vote for Proposed Amendments 4a and 4d to the Standing Rules

13 Yes, 2 No votes for the Proposed Amendment 4e to the Standing Rules Per the FMCA recommended Standing Rules format (our Chapter Standing Rules don't state specifically the vote required for amending them), a majority affirmative vote is required to amend them – all the proposed amendments to the Standing Rules received a majority vote, and therefore all passed.

To briefly remind everyone: The Chapter Bylaws amendments dealt with holding only one (versus the previous two) business meeting per year, when the Chapter secretary is required to furnish the chapter info to FMCA, and changes to reflect changes in the National bylaws. The Chapter Standing Rules amendments dealt with allowing guests at Chapter functions, refunds for rally cancellations, holding one business meeting per year, and reimbursement for attending National meetings. Further details can be found in our last Chapter newsletter.

We are making some minor changes to our Chapter Web Site (thanks to our great

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webmaster Tony Munson!!) - such as deleting the member only section (per feedback received from members). As I mentioned previously, it has not been used much, and many members were mistaken in its purpose. We haven't lost any of the still pertinent information that it contained – either put it in other locations in the web site, or referenced it. As many of you know, there are a number of sources already (such as the Yahoo forums) that many Alfa owners (including many of our Chapter members) frequent, and they also include search capabilities by topics, so we are not losing anything by deleting our members-only tab. We are also making some updates to the web site – such as changing the reference to the Medex card to the FMCAssist card in our chapter info card used to provide information to prospective new members. We welcome any comments or suggestions you may have - our web site is for all of us to use. Please forward anything you write to either Tony or me and we will certainly address it. You'll also see soon that there are minor differences to our chapter jackets and hats - the previous supplier discontinued the type jacket we were getting, but the new one is very similar – not quite as glossy, and it has a different lining that is said to be more breathable. The hats now have plastic adjustment bands for both colors.

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"Our Be Decaled (pronounced dek' ald by the Canadians) Experience".

We bought our Alfa a year ago and have enjoyed RVing in it. We think that Alfa really stands for **A** Lot For (your) Alms. We are still discovering "nice things" that come standard on Alfas. Ours is a 2005 Founder with 20,000 miles.

One big issue for us was that the previous owner had tried to take off some of the decals (dek als) and had done a very poor job and also some of the remaining decals were really weather worn. We talked about different approaches to making our coach look nice again. Full body paint is really nice but at this point it is not in our budget. We also talked about getting the strips painted on but again this was expensive and paint shops were really not interested. We thought of going to Mexico to have the work done but travelling there was not in our plans for this winter (it would be a shame to have to repair bullet holes in the new paint).

We were not sure about getting replacements but the Alfateers helped us with picking the right ones and Martin was nice enough to bring them to the FMCA rally. Our coach has a "gold" stripe that "swoops" from the rear to almost the front and is about 6 inches wide. We also have a gold stylized "sun" with rays that look like they are going about 100 mph when parked. We bought decals for both the passenger and driver sides for both the stripe and sun. The total cost was about \$550. There are also purple strips that we think represent waves so it must be a sunrise over the ocean but the interpretation changes depending on the amount and brand of beer drunk at happy hour. The purple stripes are in excellent condition.

These came as a "big roll" and we got cold feet about installing them. We thought of finding someone but found few people with experience. We were lucky in that the stripe for the driver' side had been cut to just the stripe's decal width and seemed "controllable" (6 inches by 30 feet) whereas the passenger stripe was on the a roll that was about 2.5 feet wide by 30 feet and when we unrolled it the wind just made it impossible to control.

Just a note on how the decals work. The ones we got were a three ply arrangement with a "stiff" waxy backing paper, the decal itself (the part that stays on the coach) and a "topping paper" that gets removed after the decal has "dried". When the factory makes the decals they typically use a huge backing sheet, the decal which typically looks pretty small compared to the backing sheet and then the topping sheet which is supplied to match the backing sheet. A lot of paper for a small amount of decal.

Once we understood that we just need the three ply sheet the width of the decal plus about 1 inch all around everything seemed controllable. Next we watched a "U Tube" video on how to install the decal. The process seemed to be straight forward. But first we needed to remove some of the old decals to make way for the new one. After some experimentation, we discovered that a hair dryer (free, [- if your wife agrees), a glass scraper that uses straight blades (\$4 at Home Depot) and mineral spirits (\$3 at Wal-

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Mart – you don't use much) makes the job easy – but time consuming. Place the hair dryer about 1 inch from the old decal and wait about 10 seconds, begin pushing the scraper under the decals and keep moving the dryer and scraper along. It won't take long to figure out the right speed to get the heat in to melt the old glue. Once the old decal is gone apply the mineral spirits with a cloth and use the scraper to clean off the glue. This takes a long time - the mineral spirits dissolves the glue but it then need to be removed with scraper (no heat is needed for this step). Once all of the glue is gone wash the area with soap and water - I just used a wetted cloth and a dry cloth.

Oops. I should have told you about some helpful things beforehand. We were very lucky in that "identical" decals were available. Where there was an existing decal (say a sun ray) we would cut out the new decal (but an inch wider than the decal proper) and use masking tape to hold it in position exactly over the old one. Once we were sure that the new one was in the right spot we would take more masking tape and partially "frame" the edges of the new decal. We used enough "framing" masking tape that we were confident that the new one would be in the right position. Remove the new decal and follow the procedure for removing the old one. We also made sure that we marked on the topping sheet "top" "rear" on it. On the sun rays we actually fitted all the new rays (but all cut independently) over the old ones and labeled them as to 3, 9, I2 o'clock position as well as "front" and "bottom". Once all had been "framed" we took the new decals down and then removed all of the old decals at one time.

By this time the entire campsite was interested in our adventure and when I looked back from the ladder there were 12 lawn chairs with "students" watching. Luckily I didn't wear my plumbing shorts with the low rise rear. I think the main thing learned was that regardless of the number of beers they provided I was only going to do our coach. I also noted that there was much more interest when Maureen was on the ladder, I believe this was due to my lecture ability when not directly involved in the work.

The next event is the scariest in applying the decals but when you actually look, even the long stripes are broken by fridge vents, lockers, slide outs etc. This means you are actually dealing with shorter pieces of decal and if you have good "framing" to know the final position, it is easy. To apply we bought a spray bottle at Home Depot (\$3) filled it half full of water (1/2 pint) and about 5 drops of dish detergent. With two people one starts to peel the backing paper off the decal while the other sprays the back (glue side) of the decal. It is amazing how the pre soapy water decal is incredibly sticky but once wetted become "slippery". A quick soapy spray on the coach where the decal is going and then it's just moving it around until it is in the right place. We found in bright sunlight (a no-no but sometimes you have no choice) we needed to spray the topping paper to allow us time to move the decal into place. Typically you have about 3 minutes from laying the decal on until it does not want to move around, although spraying more soapy water on will extend this time. Once it is positioned you take a rubber "putty knife" (Wal-Mart \$3 for a set of a small, medium and large blade - used for applying Bondo on car repairs) and start squeezing the water from the center to the outsides. You can feel the decal "tighten" to the coach once you start this. We applied the stripe over some of the things such as the electrical outlet and the garbage can door and then used a Xacto knife and /or scissors to fit. As long as you work at a reasonable pace this works very well.

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Once everything is "set", wait between 1.5 and 2 hours (we found the 1.5 hours worked well) and then peel of the topping paper. Hopefully everything will be tight but we found that the decal was "super sticky" again, and just rubbing a finger along the edges makes everything stick. We had a few air bubbles but the U Tube video said just use a pin and press flat and this worked for us.

You need to wait four days to wax the new decals with carnuba wax.

The driver's side stripe was cut at the factory to the exact width of the decal (topping and backing paper were exactly the same size as the decal) which was easy to handle but made it more difficult as our "framing" masking tape was right up against the edge of the old decal so I was worried about getting all of the old glue off versus loosening the masking tape with the mineral spirits. Also when removing the topping paper we need to "pick" at it to get a start for pulling it off. In this case it is directly over the decal rather than having a 1 inch border to lift and we used a pin to help start the top sheet removal. We much preferred to work with a decal with the one inch extension but it worked with the exact cut. Also the 1 inch is just an "eyeball" one inch as the masking tape framing is set against the edge of the decal so you do not need to measure or cut precisely.

To do both sides with suns, rays and the big strip took about 2 days. Some of the time was spent waiting for the sun to move off an area and for the "paint to dry". It really was not hard but did require time on the ladder. We think that our coach now looks "complete" and are very happy with the results. Most decals work like the ones we bought but next time we would be sure to ask if these are ones that use the soapy water to apply. We understand there are some that are not compatible with the soapy water. The other question is should you remove old decals prior to being ready to install the new ones. Having the old one made "framing" really easy. Where the previous owner had removed the decals we spent considerable time looking for changes in color to the fiberglass and took measurements from the "big" decal prior to cutting it into its components to make sure we could get it in the new one in the right place. I probably would wait till I have the new decal before removing the old one.

Also it might have been possible to apply the sun and rays as one piece (without cutting each piece out) but handling a sheet that size would require two people on ladders and to squeeze the water out now is a "big thing". If the new decal was different than the old one (or on a new place) I would definitely want to "frame" all of the parts to make sure it looked right prior to installing the first piece.

So if you see a Founder with a shiny new sun and rays please stop by and say hello. For the right amount of beer I might consider helping install another decal.

Our Amish neighbors have been employing horse-drawn power since the days when horsepower had a whole different meaning! In comparison to our fast-paced society, the simpler, family-centered Amish way of life holds a special fascination. Along with various tourist and shopping venues, we will have an optional guided tour of the farmlands ending in an evening at an Amish farm where we will be served dinner, and the family will lead a discussion and answer period. Recipe from Lorraine Lynch that is low in calories, but GREAT in taste!

If you like Reuben sandwiches you'll love this low-calorie casserole version! Also you can make this casserole up to 8 hours ahead. Assemble, cover and chill. Let stand at room temperature 30 minutes before baking.

Preheat oven to 350

REUBEN BAKE

5 cups peeled, cubed baking potatoes
1/3 cup fat-free sour cream $\frac{1}{2} \text{ tsp. caraway seeds}$ 1 cup finely chopped lean deli corned beef $\frac{1}{2} \text{ tsp. salt}$ $\frac{1}{4} \text{ tsp. pepper}$ $\frac{1}{4} \text{ cup fat free Thousand Island dressing}$ Cooking spray $1 \frac{1}{4} \text{ cups (5oz) shredded Swiss cheese,}$ Paprika $\frac{1}{4} \text{ cups (5oz) shredded Swiss cheese,}$ $\frac{1}{4} \text{ cups (5oz) shredded Swiss cheese,}$

Bring potatoes to a boil, cover, reduce heat and simmer 20 minutes or until very tender. Drain well. Combine potatoes, sour cream, milk, salt & pepper and beat with mixer at medium speed for 2 minutes or until smooth. (I add an additional 2 Tbsp. of water to help with consistency. Set aside. Coat nonstick skillet with cooking spray, place over medium heat until hot. Add cabbage, corned beef and caraway seeds. Sauté 4 minutes or until cabbage wilts. Remove from heat, stir in dressing. Spread half of potato mixture in bottom of an 11x7 inch baking dish coated with cooking spray, top with cabbage mixture and sprinkle with 1 cup cheese. Spread remaining potato mixture over cheese, top with remaining cheese and sprinkle with paprika.

Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes or until golden. Yields: 6 servings of 1 1/3 cups

PER SERVING: 260 calories, 8.9 grams of fat, 530 mg sodium, 3.2grams fiber
