
On behalf of Family Motor Coach Association I would like to congratulate the members of the AlfaSeeYas Chapter on your tenth anniversary.

Richard had so many nicknames, back at Alfa they called him Bulldog, and at Alfateers he would love to say his name was Tony Montana from the movie Scarface, and he would always quote "When was the last time you saw a bad guy like me"

Unfortunately, Richard & his family were planning a trip to Hawaii this year in mid July before Ricky graduated high school next year. Richard wanted his son to see Pearl Harbor before he joins the service like his father. We are very sad to know he never got the opportunity to take him there. Our hearts are truly in pain for this tragic and unexpected loss, and our thoughts and prayers go out to his family.

# FMCA 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration in Gillette, Wyoming By Mike Lynch



ALFA SeeYas were well represented at the FMCA's 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration. Five coaches met in Buffalo, Wyoming: Randy & Terry Scott, Mike & Kathleen Stinson, Ken & Ellen Hall, Marvin & Marian Grier, and Lorraine & I. We caravanned to Gillette where we met up with Randy & Debbie Sherrow, Charlie & Donna Musgrave, Joe Stravisch and his fiancé Jayne. In addition, we had a Happy Hour with free pizza where 42 ALFA owners gathered to socialize and talk about our coaches. We recruited 6 new members and one renewal. We even had entertainment as we watched a 40' diesel get stuck in the mud and then get towed out. Did I mention it RAINED while we were there?

Now to business: FMCA recruits 800 new memberships a month. Unfortunately, the rate of memberships dropping off the rolls due to lifestyle changes has outpaced the number of renewals and new members. From October 2012 to June of this year, the membership has decreased 4235 members. We presently have 79,303 members. At last year's Governing Board meeting, the Executive Board tasked the national office staff with identifying \$1.2 million in expenses that could be reduced over the next 12 months. This effort has resulted in FMCA actually experiencing a positive fiscal year in 2012 and so far in 2013. No money has been withdrawn from FMCA investments since November 2011. The Board approved a budget for 2014 that shows a projected surplus. The staff has been cut to 37 full time, 4 permanent part-time employees and two temporary fulltime employees to implement transition to a new computer system. The biggest debate concerned, going back to 2

conventions a year and where they should be. It is interesting what determines a suitable location: first, hotel rooms in the vicinity for 1500 vendors, second, parking and facilities, and finally state laws that allow RV dealers from out of state to sell motor homes. Most states have laws, intended for car dealers that prohibit out of state dealers from selling vehicles. To get enough different kinds of motor homes, there were dealers from many states at Gillette. Next year there will be a winter convention in Perry, Georgia and a summer one in Redmond, Oregon.

The final event was election of National Officers. The new National President is Charles Adcock, Senior Vice President is Jon Walker, National Secretary continues to be Vicky Ferrari and National Treasurer will be Percy Bell. Like any change of officers, they have great plans to improve things.

Fantasy Tours offers a discount for FMCA members. Another benefit comes from being a member of the FREIGHTLINER Club. There is still a connection between Freightliner, owned by Mercedes, and Chrysler which results in very good prices on Jeeps. If you intend to buy a new Jeep, and are a member of the Freightliner Chassis Club, you can get a purchase number from Steve Bartorson, President of the Club, to give to the dealer. It was a good Celebration and the Governing Board believes FMCA is well positioned for the future.

# Helpful Hint

We recently had a problem with the 'big slide' on our 2004 Alfa See Ya that I wanted to share with you. We had a problem in extending it and then retracting it - and happened to be about 100 miles from Charlie's Service in Sunset, Utah. We had it converted to a center drive with the Klauber motor several years ago. Charlie's folks found that the bolts holding in the motor were loose, and caused the front shear pin to break. They were able to fix and adjust the slide, and it has worked fine since. After relating this to Mike Lynch, he checked his and found the motor bolts loose also. Therefore, I'd suggest if you have had the 'big slide' center drive conversion done, check (or have someone check for you) the bolts holding in the motor to make sure they are tight.



# Information for the Pre-Rally

For those going to the FMCA Rally after the Pre-Rally, and want to park with the Chapter, you must register for the FMCA Western Area Rally <u>separately</u> on-line or by snail mail, AND must select the "GENERAL PARKING WITH ELECTRIC" parking option and specify that you will be arriving with a scheduled caravan (Alfa SeeYas). If you did not select and pay for that option, you will be parked in the area that you selected and not with the Chapter.

Those that are going to the FMCA Rally should arrive at the RV Resort with enough propane to cook, heat water, and heat your rig during the FMCA Rally. If you arrived at the Resort without sufficient propane, please go to the Registration Office and ask when the propane truck will be at the Resort. We will have electric at the FMCA Rally, but it will be a max of 30 amp service and at the end of a long line of other users. Therefore, you will need to maximize the use of your propane water heater, propane stove/oven, and furnace, and minimize the use of electrical devices such as your microwave/convection oven, hair dryers, air conditioner, etc. If at all possible, do not use your air conditioner as the temperatures should be mild. Instead, open windows and vents, and use your window shades and screens, etc. Remember, if you lose power from overloading the circuit, so did a bunch of other folks who will not be happy campers. Additionally, you will need to dump your grey and black holding tanks and fill your fresh water tank while you are at the Resort, preferably on Monday before we depart on Tuesday for the fairgrounds.

For those that are going to the FMCA Rally after our Pre-Rally, we will be caravanning to the Fairgrounds a day ahead of the official start of the Rally; therefore, your wagon master will be collecting \$20 per rig Saturday morning for the extra day of parking at the Fairgrounds. We prefer cash since the Fairgrounds requires cash.

FRIDAY: ARIVAL DAY: Larry and Dale will greet you as you enter Emerald Desert RV Resort, assign and escort you to a site, and give you a welcome packet containing lots of information and stuff. After you get set up, please take a few minutes and review the materials in the packet. (There will be a test later - just kidding! ©).

**Social Hour and Dinner**. We will meet in the Main Hall at 5 PM for social hour (BYOB) followed by a catered "Boot Scoot'n" BBQ dinner at 6 PM followed by music and dancing. If you are so inclined, wear your boots, and western duds. Please bring the appropriate meal ticket.

#### SAFETY HINT

# What To Bring To Bed With You

Tell your spouse, your children, your neighbors, your parents, your Dr's office, the check-out girl at the market, everyone you run across. Put your car keys beside your bed at night !!!

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies.

This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator. Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until you reset it with the button on the key fob. It works if you park in your driveway or garage.

If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are the burglar/rapist won't stick around. After a few seconds, all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and sure enough the criminal won't want that. And remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there.

The same could be useful for any emergency, such as a heart attack, where you can't reach a phone. Someone suggested to carry the car keys with them in case they fall outside and they can't be heard. They could activate the car alarm and then someone (hopefully) knows there is a problem.
