you to Larry York for volunteering to write an article for our newsletter. During our chapter pre-rally, we held our annual chapter business meeting; and we made a deposit with the folks at the Emerald Desert Resort in Palm Desert to again hold our annual pre-rally there in January 2015. We were very fortunate to have a number of our chapter members again help with the FMCA Western Area Rally by volunteering to monitor seminars. At the Western Area Rally, FMCA President Charlie Adcock held the President's seminar, which a number of

us attended. Charlie stated that FMCA was in a better financial position than in the past, and that he personally would like to have FMCAssist (or a similar program) reinstated as a free benefit with FMCA membership (as a number of members dropped out after the decision was made several years ago to exclude it due to FMCA's dire financial straits at that time). An FMCA committee is studying it and he hoped that results would be provided in time to have a vote at the governing meeting during the August 2014 FMCA Rally. He also informed us that FMCA recently was able to extend the member benefit for purchasing Michelin tires to sizes suitable for autos and Type B & C motor homes; and emphasized volunteerism is what enables FMCA and its chapters to operate including the need for volunteers for the 2014 Redmond Rally. Charlie also announced that the FMCA rally in March 2015 will be in Pomona, CA (a location that many members have requested for several years), the Summer 2015 FMCA Rally will be in Madison, WI, and they are now looking at potential locations for the March 2016 Rally - to include locations in Texas - if that state's Dept. of Motor Vehicles will allow sales of motorhomes at the rally.

Upcoming events of importance to our members include the FMCA National Rally in Perry, GA to be held March 17-20, 2014, and the national rally in Redmond, OR to be held August 13-16, 2014. We are currently looking at the possibility of having an AlfaSeeYas Chapter pre-rally to the Redmond FMCA rally and then caravanning over and parking together at the FMCA rally - we will provide more information once we finalize it. Since our Chapter National and Alternate Directors will be unable to attend the Governing Board meeting at the Redmond FMCA rally, I was asked and elected during our Chapter annual business meeting in January, to represent our chapter at that Governing Board meeting.

As I mentioned above about Charlie Adcock stressing the need for volunteers, we need volunteers to run for offices in our Chapter. To remind everyone, we have 6 elected officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, National Director and Alternate National Director. All terms are for 2 years. Our current officers were all elected in January 2011, and re-elected in January 2013 - meaning by the next election they will all have served a total of 4 years. At our chapter business meeting in January, I asked for volunteers to serve on a nominating committee and/or to run in the election for officers. Unfortunately, I received none, so I will need to contact members to ask them to volunteer. If you would like to volunteer to run for an office in our Chapter, please respond to me directly. Our elections will be held towards the end of this calendar year, and ratified at our chapter annual business meeting in January 2015. Please consider running for an office - it is a very rewarding experience and you are able to shape the future of our Chapter.

As always, please feel free to contact me to suggest Chapter event sites, and especially if you would like to volunteer to be a wagon master. It is fun, we are able to provide help, and it is a great experience for

COPPER PENNIES

2 lbs carrots, sliced in 1/4 inch rounds. (About 4 1/2 cups) Cook carrots in small amount of water till just tender. about 8 to 10 minutes. Drain, and put in a bowl. Combine with:
1 medium onion sliced and separated into rings, and
1 green pepper, cut into thin strips.

stir together: one 10 3/4 ounce can condensed tomato soup 3/4 c vinegar 1/3 c sugar 1/4 c olive oil, or other vege oil 1 t Worchestershire sauce 1 t prepared mustard salt if desired. Pour over veggies in bowl and stir. Cover and marinate overnight. keep refrigerated.
