Some poor soul tried it the night we were there, but didn't come close to finishing it. We discovered a new attraction on our second day in Amarillo: an RV museum. The museum doesn't do much advertising; we had heard about it by word-of-mouth. It is housed in a large building in the back of the Jack Sisemore Traveland RV dealership. The museum has a very nice collection of beautifully restored RV's, with the highlight being the 1948 Flxible bus that was used in the

movie "RV", starring the late Robin Williams. Flxible bus conversions were popular in the early days of RVing, and it is a Flxible that appears on the FMCA logo.

2016 AOC Rally Held in Yuma, AZ

Many of our chapter members could be found in Yuma, Arizona this spring for the 40th annual rally of the Alfa Owners Club (AOC). After the last three years in Casa Grande, Arizona the Rally was held this year at the Fortuna de Oro RV Resort, a large Cal-Am "snowbird" park.

The Rally started on Monday, April 11th, but most of the AOC chapters held pre-rallies at the park starting several days before. By the start of the Rally, approximately 90 Alfa motor homes and 5th wheels were in the park.

This year's Rally Masters were Suzanne & Leigh Connor from the South Loafers chapter (and also AlfaSeeYas members). They were assisted by John & Karen Ratcliff and Howard & Barbara Stucker. For a long time, it looked like there would not be a Rally this year, but these three couples stepped in last fall and despite the limited amount of time, organized and carried out a great Rally.

As usual, dining and socializing were a big part of the Rally, from the afternoon happy hours to the welcome dinner on Monday night to the farewell dinner on Saturday. One highlight this year was the 40th anniversary luncheon on Wednesday. Entertainment was provided by 'Bernie and Red', whose comedy hijinks--focused on RV'ing--kept the audience in stitches.

Numerous vendors were on-hand to display their wares and conduct seminars to enlighten Rally attendees on various topics. Fire Suppression System By Dale Prichard Alfa Roadrunners President <u>gatorcq@gmail.com</u>

With the recent event of 2 Diesel RV's having engine fires, I thought it was time to review and evaluate current fire suppression and submit my review.

What is the cost of prevention? Will your insurance cover complete replacement or partial repair?

I reviewed both Halon and Foam systems. Halon which is a gas, would tend to disperse fastest due to the airflow. This would cause a loss of suppression in case of an engine fire.

Foam is the current standard and has greater success in fire suppression inside engine compartments. The temperature that the suppression will release is set at 286 degrees F, which is standard.

The system I have selected is sold by Mac the Fire Guy <u>www.macthefireguy.com</u> System SS200/90 at \$460.00 retail pricing, plus shipping cost.

I ask you to think about what the cost is for peace of mind?

TECH ISSUE By Ed Burrows

For those who had windows de-fogged at the AOC Rallies (or at any time), Leisure Coachworks says it is important to reseal the top of the window and about one third of the way down each side. This is the same sealing that Alfa did on the original installation. This seal is broken during removal of the window. Sealing will help to keep water from entering the sidewall of your coach. I used clear silicone, purchased from Leisure Coachworks.

How Do I Get Started With Changing My Eating Habits



- Set short-term goals and write them down.
- Make one or two changes at a time and start with something easy.
- Tell yourself to eat until you are satisfied, not until you are stuffed.
- Take your time, eat slowly, and enjoy your food.
- Keep a food record to help you see where changes can be made.
- Consider some of the following to get started:
 - Eat more fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and low fat dairy products These are good for you and help to fill you up.
 - o Drink a glass of water before eating.
 - Drink water, diet sodas or artificially sweetened drinks instead of sugar-sweetened beverages.
 - Get rid of snack foods high in calories, fat, and sugar. If you don't have these foods available, you won't be as tempted.
 - o Have healthy snacks easily available.
 - o Broil, bake, steam or grill your food instead of frying it.
